Local Members and State Partners

Alliance Local Members

1. Local Members are local alliances (coalitions) of at least five different community sectors that meet regularly to plan and take action to reduce or prevent youth risk behavior (linked to substance abuse prevention) and/or promote positive youth development.
2. Community sectors may include, but are not limited to:

Youth	Human Services
Parents	Public Health
Business Community	Continuing and Higher Education
Media	Healthcare professionals, including mental health and substance abuse
Law Enforcement and Justice	State, Local and/or Tribal government agencies
Schools (public and private)	Other organizations involved in reducing substance abuse
Civic & Volunteer Groups	
Youth-Serving Organizations	Religious &
Fraternal Organizations	
3. Local coalitions apply to the Alliance for membership and are accepted if they meet the requirements outlined in #1 and #2 above.
4. Local Members are entitled to all membership services at no or low cost, and are eligible to apply for Alliance competitive grants and scholarships.
5. Local Members are required to maintain up-to-date contact information and a current profile of their activities at www.allwisyouth.org

Alliance State Partners

1. State Partners are state-level entities whose purpose is to serve local coalitions, communities or programs in some capacity and who are interested in youth risk behavior prevention (linked to substance abuse prevention) and/or positive youth development.
2. State Partners may be state-level not-for-profit corporations or associations, for-profit corporations or associations, government or tribal entities or programs, or educational institutions.
3. State Partners participate with the Alliance in mutually beneficial ways, such as providing information, co-sponsoring events, or assisting with membership services.
4. State Partners are accepted based upon mutual agreement between the State Partner's designated representative and the Alliance Director.
5. Representatives of State Partner organizations may serve on the Alliance Advisory Council at the invitation of the Alliance Director.
6. State Partners are restricted from applying for Alliance competitive grants and scholarships, which are intended for Alliance Local Members.
